## Principal's Message

We wish all the families of MMS to have a joyful holiday season. We also want our kids to experience joy every day at school while they learn.

Why do people learn? I don't mean inside school—I mean learning as a part of life. Surely a large part of our learning is necessary for survival and a basic quality of life. But there is another, entirely different, reason to learn. Learning gives us pleasure. This kind of learning is often (but not always) motivated from within, and no outside forces or coercions are needed. We also don't mind the possible difficulties in this learning. We often expect the challenges we encounter; we tend to see them as a natural part of the learning process, so we are far more open to taking risks. Some love to learn about cars, others love to learn about history, and some find great joy in learning how to dance. According to Mihaly Csikszentmihalyi (1990), such learning is an example of flow, which he defines as -the state in which people are so involved in an activity that nothing else seems to matter; the experience itself is so enjoyable that people will do it at even great cost, for the sheer sake of doing it.

If we want students to experience more flow in school—if we want them to see school and learning as joyful—we need to rethink how and what we teach. No longer can schooling be primarily about creating workers and test takers, but rather about nurturing human beings (Wolk, 2007). By helping students find the pleasure in learning, we can make that learning infinitely more successful.

I borrowed these ideas from <http://www.ascd.org/> I think it's important that we encourage our kids to see the joy in their learning and to enjoy school as much as they can. This comes from building strong relationships, creating learning opportunities that are challenging yet safe and most of all engaging.

I hope all of our kids are finding happiness at school, at home, and in the community.  
I hope all of our families have a joyful holiday season and Christmas.

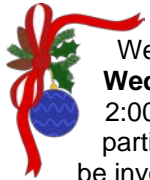

## Winter Issues

Here is some information you just might want to know about for the cold season that is now upon us:

- **Late buses?** In the event that a bus is running late, it will be identified as such under the HSD website ([www.hsd.ca](http://www.hsd.ca)). Simply go to Departments > Transportation > **Bus Delay Bulletins**. Click on that icon and check for such information (if you don't have Internet, perhaps check with a neighbour who does). Homes will not be called individually to inform you of buses that are running late.
- **Storm/Cold Day/Bus cancellations?** In the case of school closure or the cancellation of bus service throughout HSD, parents will receive a phone message from the division's information call system, as well as, several announcements will be made **between 6:00 AM – 8:00 AM** on a variety of local and provincial media outlets including: AM 1250, Mix 96.7, SteinbachOnline.com and CJOB. Such information will also be posted on the HSD website.
- **Indoor/Outdoor Recess?**  
We strongly encourage students to come to school with warm enough clothes to be able to enjoy 30 minutes outside at noon recess. If the temperature/wind chill drops to below -25°C we consider shortening the outdoors time to just 15 minutes, and if it's just too cold, we call indoor recess (although we really try not to totally cancel outdoor time because of its positive value for our students).
- **Bikes?** Please instruct your children not to come to school on bikes during the winter. Slippery streets make bike travel extra dangerous when mixed with bus, pedestrian, and extra winter vehicular traffic.
